RESOLVED 39/23

That, pursuant to section 46(4)(b) of the *Planning Act 1999*, the Development Consent Authority defer consideration of the application to develop Section 1672 (120) Nolan Road, Lambells Lagoon, Hundred of Guy for the purpose of clearing of native vegetation for a period of 12 months to require the applicant to provide the following additional information that the Authority considers necessary in order to enable the proper consideration of the application;

 Evidence of a commercial groundwater extraction licence being granted by Water Resources Division of Department of Environment, Parks and Water Security for the activity proposed by the application.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

- The Development Consent Authority considered all elements of the proposal and the applicant's request for a deferral of the application and determined to defer the consideration of the application for a period of 12 months until a commercial groundwater extraction licence application is determined by DEPWS.
- 2. A 12 month time limit is imposed to give the applicant sufficient time to inform and complete the commercial groundwater extraction licence application process.
